MORE THAN HALF A MILLION AUSTRALIANS HAVE MADE THE SWITCH TO GREENPOWER

The first Quarterly Status Report for 2007 has been released. The report covers the period from 1 January to 31 March 2007 and is available on the national GreenPower website at www.greenpower.gov.au

Key achievements for the first quarter of 2007 include:

- Nationally, there are more than 500,000 customers subscribing to GreenPower;
- The net increase in GreenPower customers since December 2006 is 118,232;
- GreenPower products totalled 28 for the Quarter, offered by 19 retailers nationally; and
- GreenPower sales for the quarter were 236,766 MWh which is a 29 per cent increase over the same period last year.
